
Atlantic City is a place of entertainment, excitement, beautiful beaches, and I know it will reflect the same emotions in all attending. See you in April!

Donna Butchko, chair of the nominating committee, said, "It is our goal to have an election for all positions, meaning that we need at least two candidates in every position. Please let me know if you may be interested in being nominated from the floor at Spring Conference, and I will provide you with the information that you will need." Email Donna at dbutcho@epix.net.

Clubs have received brief biographies of the candidates to share with members. Candidates will have an opportunity to address Conference attendees Saturday morning, and delegates will vote in the afternoon.

UPDATE (AS OF 3/12/2013)

By now, all clubs should have discussed the candidates, and your delegates are ready to vote your wishes at Spring Conference for Governor-Elect, Region Secretary and District 1 Director (for those of you in District 1). We've had some more changes since then. District 1 Secretary Susan van Raalte has decided to resign and run for District 1 Director, so we have the District 1 Secretary position open. And, due to escalating job responsibilities, District 2 Director Zarita Mattox has given her resignation, effective April 27. I know we wish Zarita and Kathy Oldenborg (our out-going Governor-Elect) the best of luck with work, even as we will miss both of them on the Region Board.

We now have another open position for District 2 Director. We will be looking for nominations from the floor for that position. And since we didn't find out about Susan's decision to run for District 1 Director until too late in the

process to solicit nominations, that position will also be filled by nominations from the floor. If any of our other board members should decide to run for one of the open positions, we will also solicit nominations from the floor for those positions, too.

To explain some of these openings, our bylaws state that you can only be under consideration for one position, so when a board member decides to run for a different position, she is required to resign her current position prior to the election. That's why you see so many resignations effective with Spring Conference. The goal is to come out of the election without any open positions, rather than just moving the openings around. It feels a little odd at times, however, it is the best way to ensure that we end the election with all board positions filled, which is the ultimate goal. So be prepared, if any other board members decide to run for one of the open positions—for example, the District 2 Secretary running for District 2 Director—we will have more open positions to be filled by nomination from the floor. While it may be challenging, I'd say overall it is an excellent process.

For those of you that might be interested in being nominated from the floor for one of the open positions, or even just learning more about the process in case a position of interest comes open, please reach out to me or a committee member to understand the process and be prepared should the occasion arise.
